## SUBJECT/AGENDA TITLE:

A Resolution Of The Longmont City Council Authorizing The City To Apply For A Grant For The 2021 Peace Officers Behavioral Health Support And Community Partnerships Grant Program

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

DOLA requires City Council approval prior to submitting an actual application for this grant. This is the new version of the Police Officers Mental Health Grant that the City received the last two years and is partially funding peer support and counseling services for Public Safety through the end of 2022. A new piece of legislation was passed this year that changed the name and greatly expanded the number of entities that can apply for the grant. Previously it was only police agencies, now it is essentially any non-profit or governmental agency. There is only one million dollars allocated for the entire State this time around. The actual notice of funding is expected to be released in late November. To submit an application, we must prove that Council has approved us to do so.
